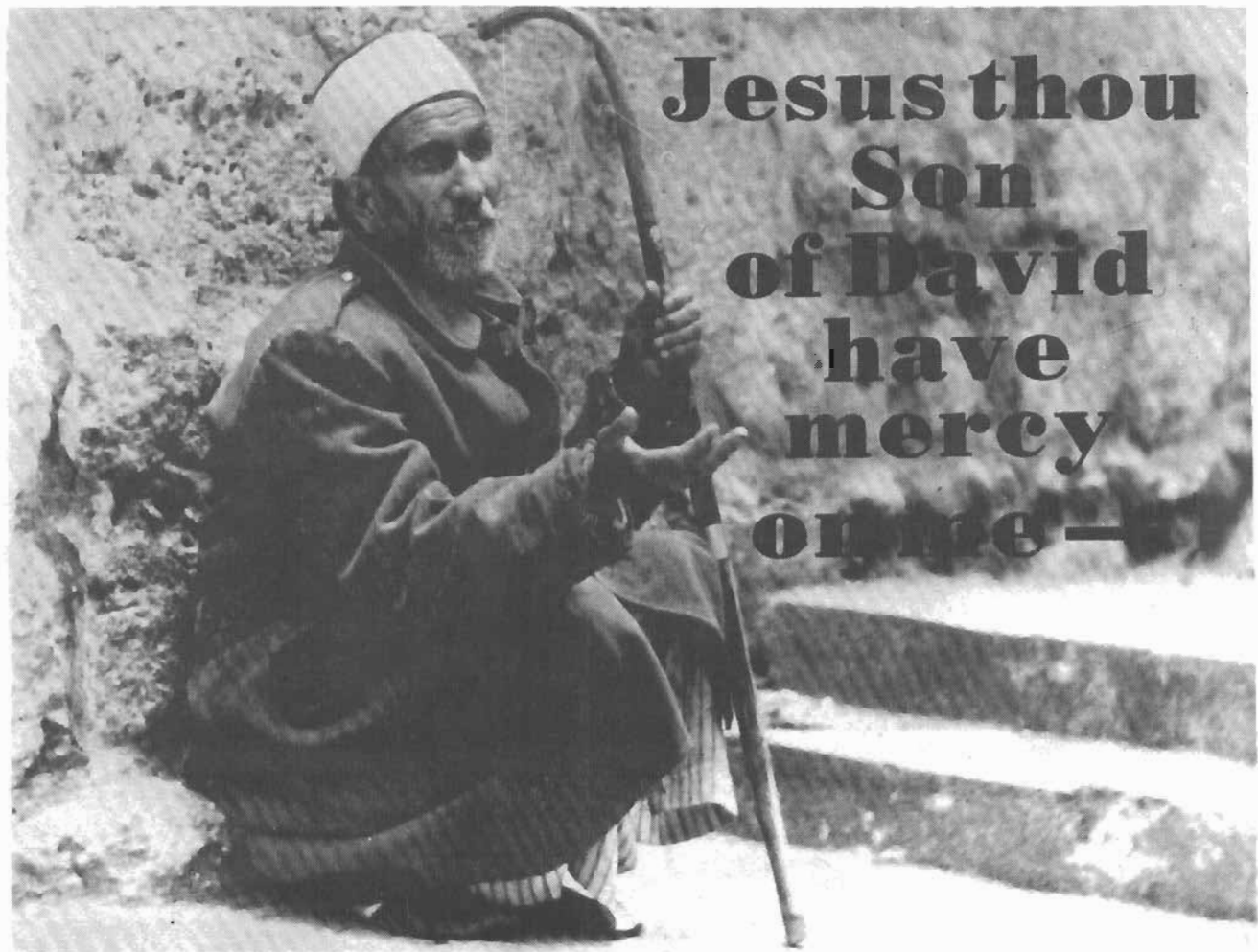

United Pentecostal and Fellowship Baptist Swap Church Buildings



United Pentecostal Church's building was too small.

Congratulations Bro. & Sis. Plowman and saints! We pray that you continue to grow.

There hardly have been enough pews to go around recently at the United Pentecostal Church at 817 North Limestone Street.

Meanwhile, the Fellowship Baptist Church, just down the street at 1313 North Limestone Street, has been using only about 5 percent of its seats each Sunday.

So, the congregations of each church have decided to swap buildings.

They will hold their first services at their respective new locations Sunday, according to the churches' ministers.

"We have just outgrown where we are," said the Rev. Leonard Plowman, pastor of the United Pentecostal Church, in a recent interview. "The Lord is getting a hold of a lot of hearts."

Plowman said his church's membership has nearly doubled in the past two years. It has about 140 members, and more people are joining practically all the time, he said. The building, which is about 20 years old, has a seating capacity of 180.

The minister said that at one time, the congregation decided to sell the church building and build a new one. "But the astronomical cost of building a new building discouraged us."

Then, about a year ago, Plowman saw that the Fellowship Baptist Church, which seats about 1,000, was for sale.

The congregations decided to

swap buildings. United Pentecostal Church is paying an additional \$90,000 for the Fellowship Baptist Church building.

"Since 1957 or '58, our church has had an attendance of less than 200 people," said the Rev. James Fenison, Fellowship Baptist Church's minister.

The church now has a membership of about 50 people, he said.

"The reason we cannot fill it up is that people don't want to believe the truth," he said. "All we can hope for is a stand for the truth, to hang in there and hope the Lord takes care of us."

Fenison said members of his church wanted to move to the smaller United Pentecostal Church building for several reasons.

One reason is that they will save thousands of dollars in maintenance and utilities costs each year, he said.

Another is that the church has decided to take a new approach in spreading the word of God. He said that rather than concentrate on building up Fellowship Baptist Church's membership, the congregation has decided to help ministers of the same faith establish a lot of small churches in other areas.

He said part of the money that will be saved from using the smaller building will be sent to a minister in Michigan so that he can start a new church there.

"We just got through organizing a church in Montana," he said.

"The Lord never put his approval on large churches," Fenison said. "In Luke, he says, 'fear not, little flock.'"

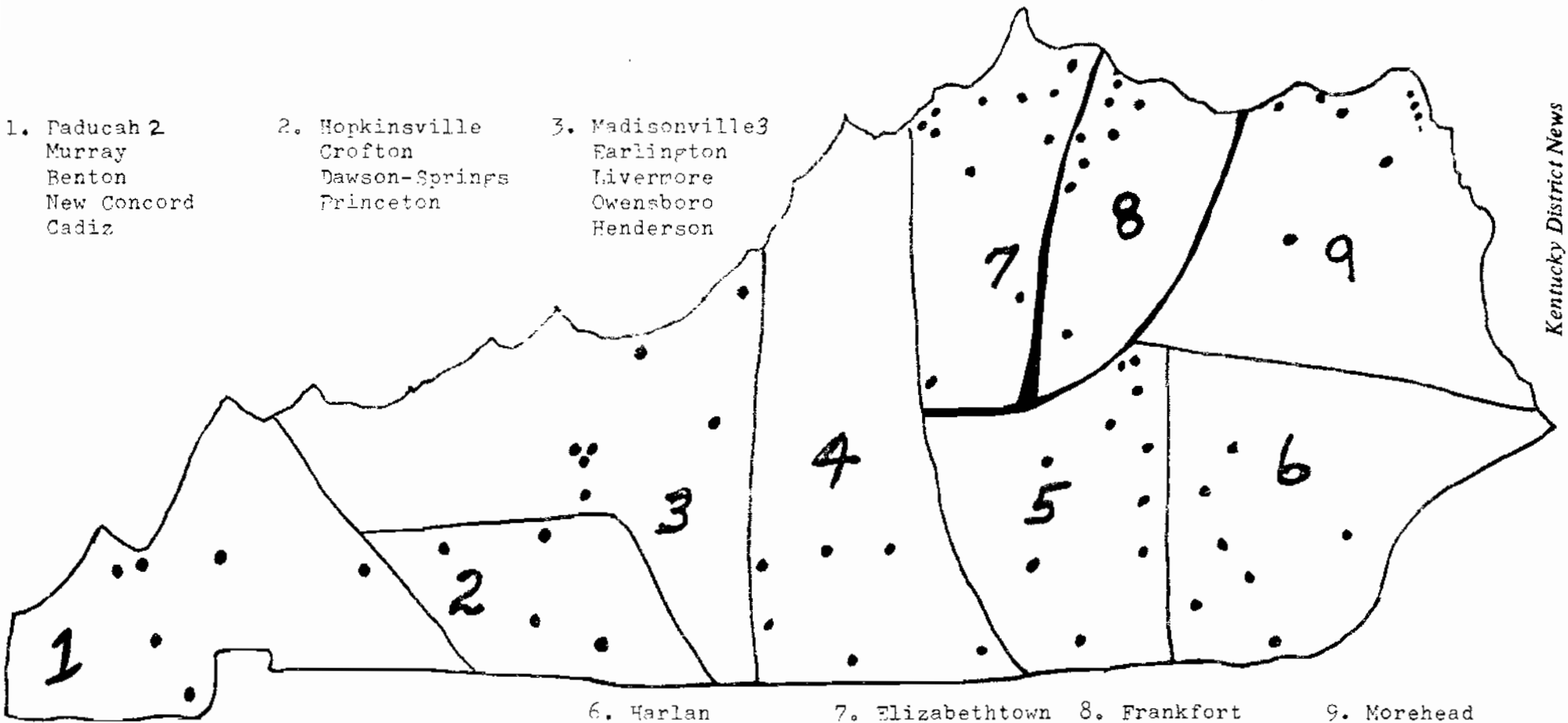

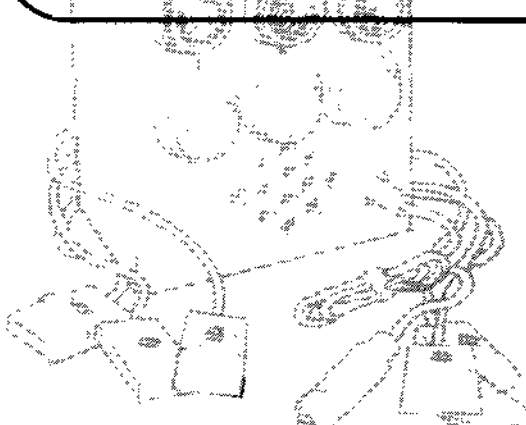
NOW...

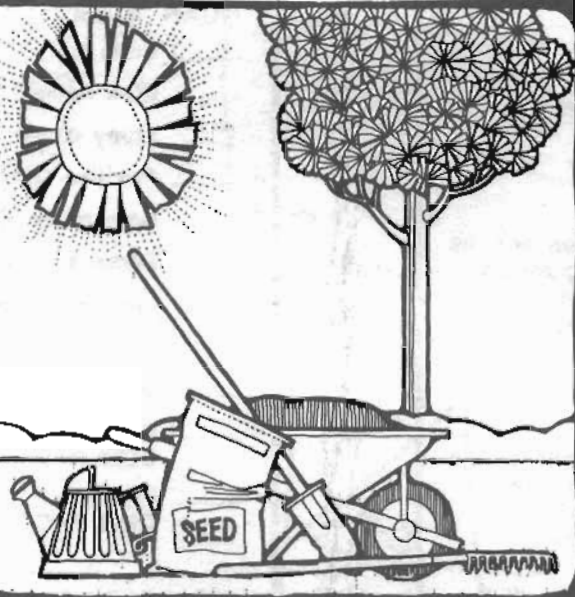
