

It was a Wednesday evening, the first day of June, just over a year ago now that the J.W. Pate family prepared anxiously for their first service in Summit, Kentucky.

With great faith in God for the future, this home missionary family gave themselves wholly to the work of God.

Seven were present for their first service. But more exciting than the first faces to join them in worship was the presence of the Almighty. It was the God who had directed them to Summit, Ky which was there for their first gathering, and the many services that have followed.

Faith in God has produced a years supply of the miraculous acts of God. From the first seven, the congregation had grown to seventeen, with seven baptized and five filled with the Holy Ghost. Seeing God perform the miracle of salvation in the lives of those you love must surely be the most gratifying feeling for anyone who has given their life to the work of God. But in home missions EVERYTHING is a miracle. And the U.P.C. of Summit have seen their share.

In need of a place of worship, the Pate family located a facility they felt would accommodate the crowd they were wanting, but the \$1,150.00 per month rent would have stressed the home missionary budget. So-o-o-o, if you can't afford the rent, buy it! With a \$5000 grant from SFC for a down payment, that is just what they did.

The building is large enough to rent a portion of the floor space, and the 2.1 acres that went with the building included a trailer park. Now instead of paying rent, they are realizing a small amount above their monthly expense for the property from the income generated by the property.

When a ceiling was needed for the building, again God supplied by moving on a man whom the Pate's had never met to write them a check for \$1100.00. Again, when in need of additional funds to fix walls and purchase a public address system, Bro. Morman of this assembly came to Bro. Pate and told him he would like to under write these expenses.

Construction continues with the addition of Sunday School rooms, a kitchen and another restroom.

To see the Lord provide again and again in these material needs inspires faith that God is doing an eternal work in the lives of many through out this community who will soon be a part of God's great kingdom.

The Pate family and the congregation of the U.P.C. of Summit would like to thank the great people of the Kentucky District for their prayers and support as they reach out to the lost of this populated region of Kentucky.

THE NATURAL PEARL

Matt. 13:45-46

Jesus tells a parable of a merchant man seeking goodly pearls. When he found one of great price he went and sold all that he had and bought it.

A man named Pierre Cartier had a pearl necklace. It had taken him years to assemble. The big beautiful oriental pearls. Daisy Plant wanted the necklace. Her husband was very rich. She still couldn't afford to spend the 1.5 million dollars for the necklace, which was what Cartier wanted. She finally traded her house for the pearls: 5th Ave. & 52nd St. in New York. This was in 1917.

In 1957, the pearls were sold at an auction for \$151,000. The former Plant mansion still houses Cartier's New York operation - and you couldn't buy it for 1.5 million dollars.

What caused the pearls to drop so much in value? The appearance of cultured pearls. When cultured pearls came in, the bottom fell out of the natural pearl market.

Both natural and cultured are formed when the oyster secretes nacre around a foreign particle that entered its shell. The difference between the two is that in natural pearls the foreign object entered the mollusk accidentally and in cultured pearls a technician inserted the object.

There was a church born one day that was a natural. It had the beauty of holiness inside and out. Man had to pay a great price to obtain this natural beauty: you had to live holy. Jesus said, "Be ye holy for I am holy". Hebrews 12:14 says that without holiness no man shall see God. I Peter 1:22 states that our souls have been purified in obeying the truth.

Natural pearls - sometimes called oriental - and cultured pearls are both considered real pearls. Even experts cannot tell the difference between a fine-quality cultured pearl and a natural one. Except by X-ray to reveal the nuchei, which differ. Man today has injected their philosophy and ideas into the word of God and have come up with the cultured church. They have made it easy to become a Christian. Their formula has flooded the world with so called cultured Christians. Jesus said in Matt. 24:4-5 to take heed that no man deceive you. For many shall come in my name saying, I am Christ or (saying I am a Christian) and shall deceive many. Matt. 24:24 states there shall arise false Christ (or Christians) and false prophets and show great signs and wonders.

Sometimes it is hard to tell the real or natural Christians apart from the cultured Christian. Some cultured Christians look and act like the real thing. But when we take the Word of God and use it to X-ray their nuclei, it will reveal the difference.

No matter how holy the cultured church world dresses, talks, acts, loves, unless they have been born again of water & spirit the natural way or rather the Bible way, (John 3:3-5, Acts 2:38) they still have been injected by man's philosophy and are not natural.

The natural pearls may have lost their real value because of the cultured pearls, but the church of the living God will never lose its value. The price for it was paid long ago on an old rugged cross. Not with dollars, but with the precious blood of Christ as a Lamb without blemish and without spot. (1 Peter 1:19).

The day is going to come when we will be able to cash in so to speak our Christian walk with God. The cultured Christian who has not obeyed Acts 2:38 to the fullest will find his life was worthless, it really had no value at all. Jesus will say unto them, I never knew you (Matt. 7:20-23). And those that are born the natural way, their lives will be priceless. We will live forever with Him. (Praise God!!!)
