



I would like to share, with our Kentucky District News readers, the following article written by the late Bill Britton. I read it recently in the Mississppi Torch. This article confirms that God can help us to use, for our benefit, that which was intended for our destruction.

You are not really my enemics at all... in reality you are some of the best friends I have. You who have lied about me, and about this ministry, who have tried to destroy people's faith and confidence in me, who have spread false and damaging rumors about my life and teachings... through your efforts there has been a work of grace wrought in this heart of mine that could never have happened without you.

My friends have been many, and loyal, and faithful to stand with me in many hours of trial and need. They have been strength in my weakness, added joy to my heart in time of sorrow, and have girded up my faith amidst raging doubts. They have brought me before the throne of grace innumerable times in their seasons of prayer. I could not have continued long in this spiritual conflict without these wonderful friends.

But, believe me, I speak in sincerity and truth, there can be no perfection in the lives of God's elect without the chastising work of a

real enemy. For when a bitter vicious person begins to do all they can to destroy me and my work for God, then there is a work done that brings out all the wrong and evil attitudes and spirits that lie hidden and deeply rooted in my heart. When a friend extols all my good virtues and praises me from their heart of true friendship, I can feel nothing but love for them. 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#### **Once for All Faith**

"Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints." (Jude 1:3).

While there are many avenues for us to pursue in this marvelous verse of sempture, I want to concentrate on the phrase, "Contend for the faith." In our examination I want to note the singleness of the faith, the *basis* of the faith, the *seal* of the faith and the *sign* of the faith.

Consider the singleness of the faith. Paul wrote the Ephesians we have, "One Lord, one faith, one baptism," (4:5). Eve heard people say, "I have my faith and you have yours." I want to be rather dogmatic about this faith. If Jude said that we "should carnestly contend for the faith" then I think we "should earnestly contend for the faith!" I don't want to be offensive or call any denomination's name, but I believe if the Almighty God knows only one faith then it will not do anyone any good to search for another. There is only one faith!

One Bible translation renders the phrase "which was once delivered" as "once for all delivered." Every translation of the Scriptures leads to the conclusion that God never anticipated changing this one faith. Many might insist they need a new faith for modern man, but they are wrong. Let's not be fooled. Man's flesh is as old as Adam because flesh does not change. People may dress it differently, but underneath it is the same old flesh. We have the same old tendencies, the same old inclinations, the same old lusts and desires, the same old hatteds and the same old evil passions. Flesh isn't modern and it doesn't need an adjustment of Scripture to address it.

Before there was a world, God prepared a plan for all that would submit to Him. "According as he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love." (Ephesians 1:4). The Old Testament marches directly toward a deliverance from our fleshly, sinful nature. The tabernacle in the wilderness was the blueprint for the future. When the Master of the Universe arrived in this world He became the second man Adam. His coming gave us the ba sis of the faith for deliverance.

This is clearly seen in a conversation between Jesus and Peter. "He saith unto them, But whom say ye that I am? And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the Irving God. And Jesus answered and said unto him, Blessed art thou, Simon Barjona: Kentucky District News \* Page Six \* June 1992

for flesh and blood hath not revealed it unto thee, but my Father which is in heaven. And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it." (Matthew 16:15-18). Some suggest that Jesus meant He would build on Peter. If that were true our building would have cruinbled for Peter has been dead a long time.

Jesus was talking about the maryelous revelation that Peter just received. Jesus was the Christ and the Rock of our salvation. He is the Chief Cornerstone. We are built on Him. He is our Sure Salvation. He took on Himself flesh and blood to become our Representative and through His blood made possible our reconciliation to God. He became our Propittator, "Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God," (Romans 3:25).

We must believe on Him as the Scriptures say. He said, "Repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem." (Luke 24:47). And, "Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of

God." (John 3:5). He's outlining the faith. The faith here has delineation. Again, I'm being dogmatic, but I'm going to contend for the faith. I must accept His doctrine, that is the *basis* of our faith.

Then Luke continues with the seal of our faith. "Behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high." (Luke 24:49). The promise is our seal. "In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise," (Ephesians 1:13). "And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto

the day of redemption." (Ephesians 4:30). The Holy Spirit, which is the promise, is also the *seal* of our faith that was once for all delivered to the saints.

Finally, the *sign* of our faith. We must do as the disciples, "be endued with power from on high." They waited in an upper room in Jerusalem. There they continued with one accord in prayer and supplication. Then, when the Day of Pentecost fully came, the Holy Ghost fell on them.

Pentecost was a feast observed by the Jews since the original erecting of the tabernacle in the wilderness. The Lord told Moses in Leviticus 23:16 to count fifty days from Passover and then celebrate First-fruits or Pentecost. So fifty days after Passover, the killing of the sacrificial lamb, the priests were to take the first bread of the harvest and wave it before the Lord in thanksgiving.

On this particular Day of Pentecost the first-fruits of the sacrificial lamb that takes away the sin of the world were giving thanks. God responded to their patient praise with a supernatural sign. He used their voices and their tongues to give Him glory when they began to speak in another language. Speaking in tongues is the sign today of the faith once and for all given to the saints. Since it is given to each believer personally it testifies that you are a partaker of the faith.

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
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


