One God Or Three?

Some of the Scriptures the "Trinity Doctrine" use to try to prove there are three persons in the Godhead, are in reality excellent proofs that there is one true and living God. For example, John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." The "trinity" interpretation of this wonderful verse steals the love of God right out of this Scripture. If we would believe their version, we would have an understanding of what happened in heaven, something after this manner.... That the "father God" was so overwhelmed with compassion for the poor distressed condition of man whom He had made until His heart was breaking for conditions on earth. He is supposed to have gone through these agonizing emotions for several thousands of years, then finally when His heart was almost to the breaking point, to turn to a younger God called the Son by His side and say, "Son, you go down to earth, suffer, bleed and die for the people because I love them so."

If this were true, it would almost take faith out of our hearts and certainly eliminate any thought of love for humanity on the part of the "Father".

THE TRUTH OF JOHN 3:16

The truth of this wonderful Scripture (John 3:16) is that God really did "so love," but it was not in allowing someone else to suffer in His stead. Luke 1:26-35 tells the story in detail of how God (Who is a Spirit) left His heavenly home and came to this earth because He so loved men who were struggling in sin and despair.

The angel Gabriel appeared to Mary who lived in Nazareth and told this virgin that she would have a son. When Mary inquired how this could be because she was unmarried, the angel explained the method of incarnation..... "The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee; therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God."

THE INCARNATION

The Spirit of God, not a little portion or fraction thereof, but the Holy Ghost overshadowed Mary and she brought forth the Son or body of God. Mary gave Jesus Christ His body. The only life He had was God in Him. "In Him dwelleth the fulness of the Godhead bodily," or in a body. John 3:34 "For he Whom God hath sent speaketh the words of God; for God giveth not the Spirit by measure unto him." The Spirit was not measured out and just a little portion given to Jesus Christ. Matthew 1:23 says He was Emmanuel, God with us. The body of Jesus was the only begotten Son..... "Thou art my son, this day have I begotten thee!"

If we just remember that when the word God is used, it refers to the Spirit or Holy Ghost. When the word Son is used it refers to the body, flesh or tabernacle in which that Spirit dwelt. Hebrews 10:5 "Wherefore when he cometh into the world he saith, Sacrifice and offering thou wouldst not, but a body hast thou prepared me."

HOW DID GOD SUFFER?

John 3:16 certainly does not mean that the older or "Father" God remained in heaven and sent a younger God to the earth in order to suffer and die. (II Cor. 5:19) God was in Christ. The Holy Spirit which Jesus referred to as "Father" was incarnate in that Body of the Son and suffered right along with every trial and temptation that the flesh suffered. Even in your own spirit, there are many times you are down hearted or "blue" or discouraged when nothing physically is wrong. However, you are crushed over some personal misfortune or that of a loved one. It may be the burden of loved ones still out of the ark of safety. Your spirit grieves. So with God. That Spirit grieved over Jerusalem....that Spirit was saddened at the grave of Lazarus....John 11:33 "he groaned in spirit." God (the Spirit) incarnate in Jesus Christ so-loved humanity that that same Spirit that overshadowed the virgin Mary remained in that body or Tabernacle called the Son, not only throughout the entire life of Jesus but for those six agonizing hours on the cross. Finally during the crucifixion when both the flesh and Spirit suffered untold pain for the souls of men and Jesus cried, "It is finished" then, and then only did that Spirit leave the body or son. "Jesus cried with a loud voice and yielded up the ghost." That was real love. The true God of heaven who was a Spirit, knew without the shedding of blood men could not be

saved and so-loved that he overshadowed Mary, was born into the world He made, lived, moved and worked in that Body or Son. ("My father worketh and hitherto do I work.") and remained in that Son until the last moment of horrible Golgotha. As the Son or Body suffered, so also the Spirit suffered. That was real love.

WHERE WAS THE FATHER?

Where was the Father when Jesus was here on earth? That question was answered by Jesus himself. John 14:8-10. Philip asked the question, "Lord show us the father and that will satisfy us." He was puzzled like many are today. He had followed Jesus for three years. Philip witnessed and rejoiced in Christ's miracles. He had heard Jesus make reference to the "Father", but where was He? These memorial words were stated by Jesus.... "The Father that dwelleth in me, he doeth the works." Jesus was subject to that Spirit all his life. At the crucifixion, the Spirit left the body for three days, then re-entered. That was the resurrection.... "Behold I was dead but I am alive forevermore. Never again will that Spirit and Body be separate...Never will we see another God only in Jesus Christ. I John 2:23...."He that acknowledgeth the Son, hath the Father also." I John 5:20.... "We are in Him that is true, even in His Son Jesus Christ. This is the true God and eternal life....Keep yourself from idols" or the trinity doctrine.
