Nothing is Impossible

I want to encourage your heart, not just for today, but for the future. **NOTHING IS IMPOSSIBLE WITH GOD!**

There are two illustrations in the Bible where the dead were raised. There is no such gift for us in the Word of God to raise the dead, but Jesus Christ was so kind to give us these examples showing that if the God we serve could raise the dead, He could do anything.

Death is the saddest thing that can happen in life. Nothing is so encouraging as to think that someone could be raised from the dead. This book is a map, not to an earthly city, but to the New Jerusalem.

In Luke 8:49, the ruler of the synagogue had a daughter at home. While he and his wife were not there, his daughter died. A servant knew where the ruler of the synagogue was so he ran to find them. The ruler and his wife were listening to a sermon of Jesus Christ's. The servant told them that their daughter had died. Jesus, hearing this news, said, "She is not dead; she is sleeping". What a statement! Even in this extreme case, there was hope - "she is not dead; she is sleeping"!

If you have a problem, if this God that we serve can raise the dead, He can answer your request, whatever it is. Jesus told the parents in verse 15 to "Fear not...believe and she shall be made whole". He went with Peter, James, John and the parents back to the home of this girl. With the simple words, "Maid, arise", life returned to this girl. The parents were astonished but very happy!

In John 11:1 we find a passage of scripture filled with discouragement

of almost every kind you can think of. This is not a fairy tale. Jesus identified the people involved. There was a certain man - Lazarus. He was sick. He lived in Bethany with two sisters - Mary and Martha. These were real people. Lazarus died. At this time, Jesus was four days away from Bethany, but He knew what was going on.

The Lord knows where we are; He knows our walk of life. He got to Bethany. He told this family that they would see the glory of God. When He arrived, the funeral was over and Lazarus was in the grave. How impossible it seemed! Lazarus' sister told Jesus that his body was decaying. If Jesus could answer this kind of situation, He could do anything. Jesus said, "Lazarus! Come forth!"

This Bible has got examples in it to help us in whatever circumstances we might be in.

In Job, we read a clear description of this man. This story is not a fairy tale. Job lived in Uz. He was a perfect, upright man who feared God and hated evil. What a reputation! He had seven sons, three daughters, seven thousand sheep and three thousand camels. This man was very careful about his family. They had feasts. He was so concerned that they might have sinned some way that he offered burnt offerings. The devil hates people that love God. Satan appeared to God and asked, "Does Job fear God for naught? If you take away his substance, he will curse you!" a very short time, Job lost all of his livestock. Then he lost his children. In all of this, Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly.

This book is full of people who faced difficulty but still served God. There are only two chapters which show Job's blessings, but forty of trouble. Don't be surprised if a friend turns against you. For forty chapters, friends found fault with Job. At the end, Job said, "The Lord has given and the Lord has taken away, Blessed be the name of the Lord". In Job 42, we find that God gave him twice as much as he had before then added 140 years to his life. If God would do that for Job, what will He do for us in the Rapture? We will live forever! This Bible is full of encouragement.

Jude contains the last sermon which tells us how to get to Heaven.

"Mercy, peace and love be multiplied...earnestly contend for the faith that was delivered to the saints". I found something in this chapter that I never fully understood before. In verse nine, after Moses died up in the mountain alone, the devil went up to do something nasty to the body of Moses. There was a fight on that mountain between Michael the Archangel and the devil, contending for the body of Moses. The devil is so nasty that he not only wants to hurt us when we are alive, but he wants to do damage to a dead body. He hates us that much. I am glad that there is an archangel to help all of us.

If Jesus Christ could help in a condition where a man was dead and decaying, if we have a God who can raise that man up, He can surely help us in any situation we are in today. We are in a wonderful company in the Family of God!

The Gospel

As preached by Rev. Urshan during Graduation 1987, St. Paul, MN

In Mark 16:16, we find the Great Commission, "Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel..." When we talk about the Gospel, we refer to the "good news". I Corinthians 15 describes what everyone everywhere considers to be the Gospel. It is the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ. But sometimes we miss the essentiality of the Gospel. THE LIFE is one of the most fascinating aspects of the Gospel.

God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory. This is all related to the mystery of the manifest God. God came into the world so that we might behold Him. God was in the world as a human bodily form. He lived with us: this is an awesome thing. It is hard for our finite minds to realize that the great Creator was enclosed in a womb for nine months. He came into this world as you and I did. The only difference was that the seed placed in Mary was the eternal Word. Angels ministered to Him. He was so powerful and holy. He subjected Himself to being a child. He came into the back door of humanity and was laid in a manger. The angels declared, "It shall be a sign unto you...ye shall find the babe wrapped in swaddling clothes, lying in a manger". What kind of a sign was this? You will find that Saviour, or salvation. His name was salvation. Shepherds went and told everyone what they had heard.

I asked my aunt for the meaning of "swaddling" clothes and she said that it was traditional to sew the names of ancestors into fabric used by royalty...for instance - Abraham, Isaac, Jacob... The shepherds were so excited - they saw Him!

Jesus was a boy so that He could understand men. At twelve years of age, He amazed the temple priests by understanding the antiquity of truth. He expressed His soul. Yet, He left with Mary and Joseph, His parents, subjecting Himself to the Law (obedience to parents) which He made.

He went to the Jordan River where He found John the Baptist and told him to baptize Him. John saw who Jesus was - the Almighty. At Gethsemane, His human will met with the eternal edict of time - "Father, if possible, let this cup pass from me; nevertheless, not my will but thine..." Calvary was incidental to Gethsemane. He subjected His will to God.

Jesus stood before Pilate's judgement hall. He did not open His mouth until Pilate said, "Don't you know I have the power to release you?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world..." The world will never be the same because He came. When He died, all creation bowed its head at the propagation of injustice; men didn't know Him, but creation did. Earth quaked...jails opened...dead raised. The Gospel shakes the world!

The resurrection was seen by the Apostles. I was not there and I did not see it physically, but He has injected hope into this life. Those who saw it preached it and turned the world upside down. Not only did the Gospel shake the world but it shook governments. The stone with the Roman seal was broken. No government can hold down the Gospel...no government can stop the Church. There is no greater power than the Gospel. The Gospel changes and transforms men and women. Paul told a philosophical age - "I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ for it is the power of God unto salvation". He also said, "You are not bought with silver or gold...ye are not your own". There is someone else who dictates your life and your future. But He also says, "I am with you...I will not leave you or forsake you..." We can meet any obstacle with Him. We can fight any battle with Him. You cannot stop anything that God has His hand on.

When this Gospel was proclaimed, it sent people who had hope for present and future. The Gospel saves to the uttermost. The Gospel is the answer to broken homes and hearts. The Gospel works best in the darkest night - in crisis spots.

The Gospel message for today declares that there is only One Healer... there is only One Deliverer...there is only One Eternal God. He came to my level to lift me to heavenly heights!

Their cry rang out - "look unto the rock whence ye are hewn, and to the hole of the pit whence ye are digged". Fifty years of history will not let us forget. ABI must, with dedication, teach and preach that of reaching the whole world with the whole Gospel. To such a high and holy mission let us rededicate all our powers, yea, our very lives, to such an incomparably blessed mission. "Therefore my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord."

Luck may be good enough for most folks, but when things get hairy and scary - like having your airplane run out of fuel over the ocean - St. Paul native, Roger Barcus and his son, Jonathan, prefer more powerful medicine. "I'll tell you one thing," Barcus said Monday. "When God has a call on your life and he's not done with you yet, he goes out of his way to help you. My son prayed and I saw him praying very earnestly. And though he's only 15, he feels the calling of God, and he said, 'Lord, don't let me die. I've got a work to do for you'. As I ran out of gas, I looked down and I saw a sailboat. It was the only sailboat we had seen, the only one around...after we got on board, we did not see another sailboat for another 24 hours", Barcus said during a telephone interview from the French island of Martinique.

How Barcus, a 1966 graduate of the Apostolic Bible Institute in Oakdale, and his son happened into such a predicament started June 4 when they flew from the Caribbean island of Grenada to St. Croix where he preached for a fellow missionary. Barcus, 40, is a missionary for the UPCI and has been stationed in Grenada for about a year. While on St. Croix, Barcus had a mechanical inspection performed on his Cessna 172 Skyhawk. "The airplane checked out fine. It was my personal aircraft and the only privately owned aircraft on Grenada," Barcus said. "There was no insurance. But I thought it necessary to get from island to island. I took the equity from the sale of a house, car and a pickup, along with a little more and bought it."

On June 12, after finishing work on St. Croix, the Barcuses flew to Puerto Rico where they shopped, purchasing Bibles and other items for mission work. "We left at 9:30 a.m. Saturday after filling the gas tanks up to the very top," Barcus remembered. He flew straight toward Dominica, then followed the Lesser Antilles Island chain down to Martinique and St. Lucia, where he was scheduled to land for fuel. "When I called the tower, they told me they had gas but couldn't find the guy who operated the fueling equipment. They guaranteed me there would be gas at the airport at the southern end. I went down south and the tower told me they had fuel, but only for jet engines." Barcus kept talking with other pilots. Then he and his son started throwing out suitcases, and everything else they had bought. He told the tower that he saw a sailing boat and had life preservers on, then told his son to get the emergency locator transmitter. "We landed about 300 yards from the boat. It seemed the water was coming up in the plane faster than I was told it should have. My only thought was to get out as soon as possible lest we get caught in the plane's suction as it went down." The rescue vessel was the 37 foot L'Orneck, built by its skipper Oliver Molones of France.
